Recycle Often – Bin located at the Club House What goes in the recycle bin?

brown paper bags, **cardboard (must be flattened)**
cans, aluminum, tin or steel, glass bottles and jars
junk mail, magazines, newspapers, phone books
paper, office and copy, paperboard, plastic bottles and containers

Cans, bottles, plastic containers, etc., need to be clean of food waste.

Do Not Recycle PLASTIC BAGS or foam cups and containers. Plastic wrap or foam cups and containers. These items go in the trash dumpsters! Clip this and put it on your fridge!

Let's Keep Healthy! There is hand-sanitizer in club house. Please use it frequently. If you find an empty container, let the office know and they'll refill it.

Let's Keep Safe! The speed limit in the park is 10 mph!
